







Tin Can Ghosts

This is a simple Halloween craft, that looks particularly effective when hung outside in the breeze.

Equipment:

Empty, cleaned tin cans White paint - left over emulsion is good White fabric, or ribbon Glue gun String Black permanent marker (eg Sharpie)

Method:

- Using the hot glue gun, put a bead of glue all around the sharp edge of the tin, to prevent cuts
- 2. Paint the outside of the tins white and leave to dry about 30 minutes, but this will vary depending on the type of paint used.
- 3. When the paint is dry, use the glue gun to attach a length of string to either side of the bottom of the tin (ie the closed end), to form a handle.
- 4. Cut strips of white fabric, about 2cm wide and in varying lengths, from about 20cm long. Alternatively, you can use lengths of ribbon.
- 5. Glue the strips around the inside of the open end of the can.
- 6. Draw on a ghoulish mouth and eyes and colour them in, using the permanent marker.
- 7. Hang outside for a spooky Halloween decoration.
